

## Director's Report on Developmental Progress Assessment

## Overview

Caesar was assessed at our center for developmental progress. The evaluation revealed **information processing delays** and **global developmental delays**, which have contributed to **acquired features of autism**, **cognitive delays**, and **speech delays**. Additionally, medical history and previous analyses suggest **potential epileptic activity**, which requires careful monitoring and integration of therapy with medical follow-up. Further analyses are necessary to better understand underlying causes and to guide targeted interventions.

## Recommended Plan

EICADD

### 1. Development Protocol for Information Processing

1. Continue with a structured developmental protocol focusing on information processing.
2. Duration: 4 months, followed by reevaluation (preferably in person).
3. Establish a baseline during reevaluation and adjust interventions accordingly.
4. Continue with the intervention plan consistently.

### 2. Main Recommended Analyses (Through Neurazon, Canada)

The recommended analyses are conducted through **Neurazon (Canada)**. These are external evaluations and not performed directly at our centers. Results will be reviewed with the guardian upon completion and incorporated into the child's developmental plan. Please refer to their report and assessment.

### 3. Therapy

- **Speech Therapy (ST):** 2 sessions per week.
- **Occupational Therapy (OT):** 1–2 sessions per week.
- **Mitotherapy (Light-Based Therapy):** 1–2 sessions per week, integrated with other therapies to support regulation, cognitive function, and developmental growth.

## Conclusion

This assessment confirms that Caesar has global developmental delays with acquired features of autism, cognitive and speech delays, and potential epileptic activity. With targeted therapy, structured protocols, and advanced analyses, Caesar remains open for improvement. Continuous collaboration with medical specialists for monitoring epileptic activity is strongly advised alongside therapeutic interventions.

## Notes on External Testing

The recommended analyses are conducted through **Neurazon (Canada)**. These are external evaluations and not performed directly at our centers. Results will be reviewed with the guardian upon completion and incorporated into the child's developmental plan.


