Khalid visited our center for a developmental progress assessment. During the evaluation, he exhibited information processing delays and developmental delays leading to **hyperlexia type 1 features**. At this stage, he does **not score as a case of autism**, but the findings indicate a risk of developing additional challenges without timely intervention. Early support can positively influence his developmental trajectory and strengthen his cognitive and adaptive skills.

Recommendations:


