Director's Report on Developmental Progress Assessment

Overview:

Nouf Ahmad K. N. Sharafaddin visited our center for a developmental progress assessment. The evaluation indicated **information processing delays** and **global developmental delays**, which have contributed to **cognitive delays**, **speech delays**, and **features of autism**.

These developmental findings highlight challenges in early communication, attention, and adaptive skills. However, Nouf's age and response to initial stimulation indicate **a strong potential for improvement** through continued early intervention and a structured developmental plan. Further analyses are recommended to better understand underlying biological and neurological contributors.

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Recommended Plan:

1) Development Protocol for Information Processing

- Continue the **developmental protocol** for 4 months, followed by a **reevaluation** (preferably conducted in person).
- Reassess progress and establish a **new developmental baseline** upon review.
- Maintain consistency in the intervention plan to strengthen communication, cognition, and social engagement.

2) Recommended Tests through Neurazon (Canada):

The recommended tests are performed through **Neurazon (Canada)**, a bioinformatics company partnered with internationally accredited laboratories. These analyses are **external, optional**, and **not conducted directly through our centers**. Parents should refer to the official plan provided by Neurazon for details about sample collection, processing, and expected timelines.

3) Recommended Therapy:

- **Rehabilitation Therapy:**

- **Plasticity Therapy** – To be introduced in **later stages** once developmental readiness improves.
- **Occupational Therapy (OT)** and **Speech Therapy (ST)** – Continue regularly to support sensory processing, language comprehension, and expressive communication.
- Incorporate early social and play-based engagement to encourage spontaneous interaction and imitation.
