Director's Report on Developmental Progress Assessment

Overview:

Latifa was evaluated at our center on 17-06-2025. The assessment revealed information processing delays and general developmental delays, accompanied by hyperlexia that aligns more closely with Hyperlexia Type 2 than Type 3. This profile has resulted in acquired features of autism, which are not indicative of true autism but are rather the outcome of her current developmental trajectory.

Hyperlexia Type 2 is typically marked by strong reading and memorization skills with accompanying challenges in comprehension and social communication. Without proper intervention, these features may intensify and further resemble the clinical presentation of autism. Therefore, additional analysis is necessary to uncover any biological, genetic, or environmental contributors.

Recommended Plan:

- 1. Development Protocol for Information Processing:
 - o Continue the targeted developmental protocol for 4 months.
 - o After this period, conduct an in-person reassessment to evaluate Latifa's progress and establish a new developmental baseline.
 - o Adjust the plan as needed based on improvements or changes.
- 2. Recommended Tests (conducted through Neurazon Canada):
 - Please refer to their report and assessment. These tests are not done at EICADD.
- 3. Recommended Therapy After Determining the Causes:
 - Begin neuroplasticity rehabilitation therapy at a frequency of 2–3 sessions per week or more, focusing on cognitive processing, language comprehension, and functional communication development.
