

## Director's Report on Developmental Progress Assessment

**Date of Visit:** 07-07-2025

**Child's Name:** Ahmed Mohammed Alshehhi

**Date of Birth:** 22-06-2019

### Overview:

Ahmed Mohammed Alshehhi was assessed at our center and presents with information processing delays and signs of regressive developmental delays. These challenges have contributed to acquired features of high-functioning autism, with clinical signs aligning with Hyperlexia Type 2. While not meeting the full diagnostic criteria for autism, the developmental profile suggests an acquired condition influenced by regression and cognitive disruption. Continued targeted intervention is required to improve developmental outcomes and support a potential progression toward Hyperlexia Type 3.

### Recommended Plan:

1. **Development Protocol for Information Processing:**
  - Begin a structured, non-medicinal intervention focused on cognitive and sensory integration.
  - Maintain the protocol for 4 months.
  - Reevaluate in person after this period to assess progress and establish a developmental baseline.
  - Continue with updated interventions based on observed improvement.
2. **Recommended Tests through Neurazon (Canada):**
  - Please refer to their report and assessment. These tests are not done at EICADD.
  - Repetition: Every 6–12 months.
3. **Recommended Therapy:**
  - **Neuroplasticity Rehabilitation Therapy:**
    - Frequency: 2–3 sessions per week.
    - To be initiated after 2–4 months, depending on developmental readiness and initial response to intervention.

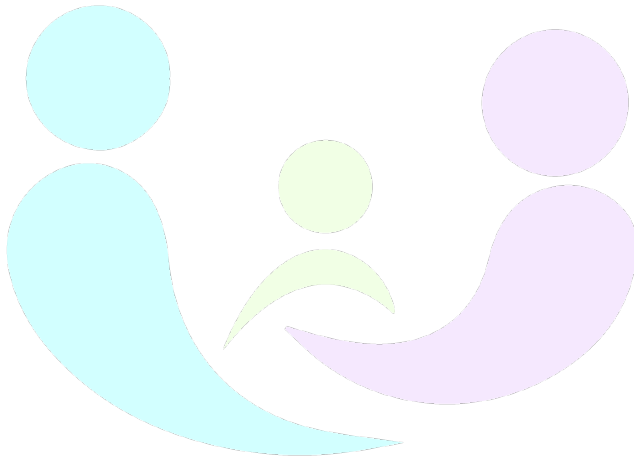
