## **Director's Report on Developmental Progress Assessment**

#### **Overview**

Ahmed-Faris visited our center for a developmental progress assessment. The evaluation showed signs of information processing delays and developmental delays, which have led to acquired features of autism. However, it is important to note that he does not score as a case of autism.

The assessment also revealed a **regressive developmental delay episode**, which may suggest potential **biological causes**. Additionally, family history is relevant: Ahmed-Faris has a sister with developmental delays, which raises the possibility of a **hereditary component**. This needs further investigation, as **no prior physical or medical assessments** have been conducted by a physician.

Ahmed-Faris requires **further analyses** to better understand the underlying causes and to create a more tailored plan.

#### **Recommended Plan**

## 1. Development Protocol for Information Processing

- Implement a structured intervention plan over the next 4 months.
- Reevaluate the child, preferably in person, to establish a clear baseline.
- Continue adjusting and supporting the intervention protocol as needed.

## 2. Recommended Tests through Neurazon (Canada)

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## 3. Recommended Therapy

• Plasticity Rehabilitation Therapy: 2–3 sessions per week
