

Director's Report on Developmental Progress Assessment

Overview:

Farah Nader Shoudi was assessed at our center on May 24th, 2025. The evaluation revealed the presence of **information processing delays** and **global developmental delays**, which have resulted in **intellectual developmental delays**. These delays are associated with identified **chromosomal abnormalities**, specifically a **duplication in chromosome 9** and a **deletion in chromosome 3**. Such abnormalities are known to contribute to neurodevelopmental challenges, learning delays, and cognitive processing difficulties.

In addition, an **MRI scan reviewed from her neurologist** showed evidence of **brain abnormalities** and **white matter delays**, which are likely contributing to the observed developmental concerns. These factors have led to **acquired features of autism**, though they do not suggest a classical autism diagnosis.

Further analysis is needed to identify the full extent of underlying causes and to implement a precision-based therapeutic plan.

Recommended Plan:

1. **Development Protocol for Information Processing:**
 - Continue with the specialized developmental intervention for **4 months**
 - Conduct a **reevaluation in person** at the end of the 4-month period
 - Update the **baseline** and revise the plan as needed based on progress
2. **Main Recommended Analysis (conducted through Neurazon – Canada):**

3. **Recommended Therapy After Determining the Causes:**
 - **Mitotherapy Therapy** – 2 sessions per week
 - **Speech Therapy (ST)** – 2 sessions per week
 - **Occupational Therapy (OT)** – 2 sessions per week
 - **Neuroplasticity Rehabilitation Therapy** – To be introduced in later stages, available in the UAE or Jordan as appropriate
