

Director's Report on Developmental Progress Assessment

Overview:

Salah Salem Alazmi visited our center on 01-06-2025 for a comprehensive developmental evaluation. The assessment confirms **information processing delays** and **intellectual developmental delays**, consistent with findings from previous studies and tests.

Significantly, prior analyses have identified **likely pathogenic variants** that may contribute to **epileptic activity** and **abnormal white matter development** in the brain. These findings underline the importance of a targeted, multi-disciplinary intervention plan.

At this stage, further detailed analysis is needed to understand how these genetic and neurological factors are impacting Salah's development and to craft a precise therapeutic strategy.

Recommended Plan:

1) Development Non-Chemical Protocol for Information Processing

- Initiate a **4-month intensive, tailored therapy program** focused on non-chemical (behavioral and neuroplasticity-based) interventions.
- **Reevaluate after 4 months** to measure progress and adjust the plan as needed.
- Establish a **clear baseline and improvement projection** for monitoring outcomes and next steps.
- Continue with **specialized sessions and therapies** designed for Salah's cognitive profile.
- **Follow up with a neurologist** to ensure thorough management of potential epileptic activity through **EEG monitoring**.

2) Main Recommended Analysis:

3) Recommended Therapy After Determining the Causes:

- **Neuroplasticity Rehabilitation Therapy:** 2 sessions per week, both now and in later stages.
- **Speech Therapy (2ST) and Occupational Therapy (2OT):** Focus on communication, sensory integration, and cognitive development.
