

Director's Report on Developmental Progress Assessment

Overview:

Fares-Raef was assessed at our center and shows signs of **information processing delays, global developmental delays, and acquired features of autism**. MRI findings provided by the neurologist indicate **potential white matter delays**, which may be contributing to his developmental presentation. These findings suggest the need for targeted intervention and further investigative testing to guide personalized support.

Recommended Plan:

- 1. Development Protocol for Information Processing**
 - Duration: 4 months
 - Reassessment preferred in person
 - Establish a developmental baseline and adjust intervention accordingly
- 2. Recommended Tests (through Neurazon – Canada):**

This is a developmental assessment, not a final diagnosis. The child's condition may improve with proper intervention. Recommended tests are external (via Neurazon Canada) and optional, meant to guide further understanding. These are not conducted at our center.

3. Recommended Therapy (Post-Analysis):

- **Mitotherapy:** 2–3 light therapy sessions per week
- **Occupational Therapy (OT):** 2 sessions per week
- **Speech Therapy (ST):** 2 sessions per week

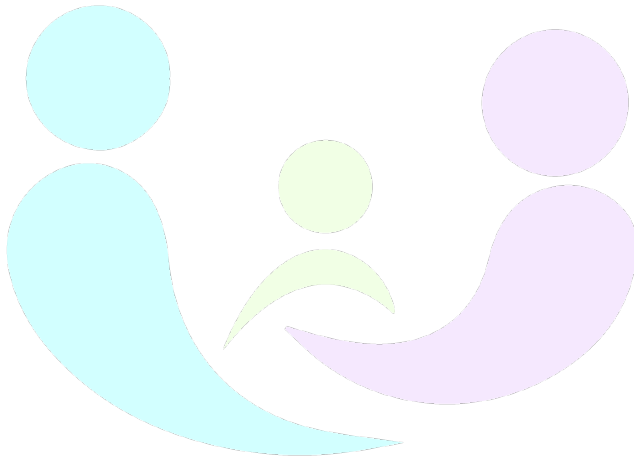
