

Director's Report on Developmental Progress Assessment

Date of Visit: 19-06-2025

Child's Name: Ali Al Habassi

Date of Birth: 17-02-2014

Overview:

Ali was reassessed at our center on 19 June 2025. The child has shown **significant improvement** following the first stage of the intervention protocols. However, the evaluation confirms the continued presence of **information processing delays** and **cognitive developmental delays**, which appear to be associated with underlying **genetic variants**. These delays, while showing a positive response to intervention, still require deeper analysis to uncover the contributing factors and guide further individualized therapy.

Recommended Plan:

1. **Development Protocol for Information Processing:**
 - Continue the current targeted cognitive development protocol for **4 months**.
 - Conduct a follow-up **in-person reassessment** after this period.
 - Use the reassessment to establish a new developmental baseline and adjust the intervention accordingly.
2. **Main Recommended Analysis through Neurazon (Canada):**
 - Please refer to their report and assessment.
3. **Recommended Therapy after Determining the Causes:**
 - **Neuroplasticity Rehabilitation Therapy**
 - Frequency: **2–3 sessions per week**
 - Objective: Strengthen neural pathways related to learning, memory, and information processing to further reduce delays and promote independence.

Follow-Up Plan:

- A **comprehensive reassessment is advised after 4 months** to monitor progress, evaluate test results, and fine-tune the ongoing therapy plan.

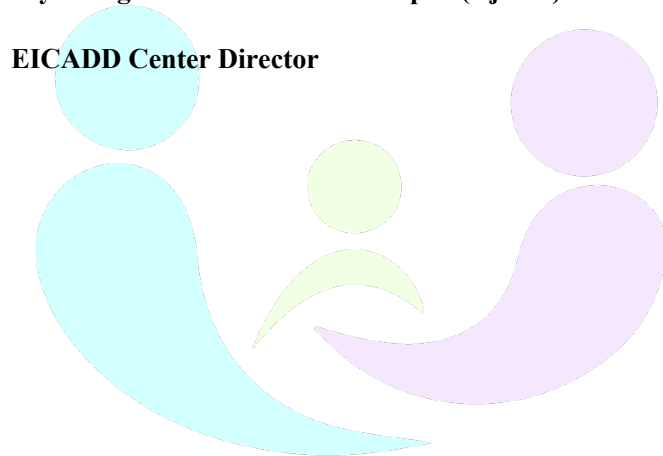
