



Director's Report on Developmental Progress Assessment

Overview:

Hamza Bitar was assessed at our center on May 26th, 2025. The evaluation indicated the presence of **information processing delays** and **developmental delays**. Encouragingly, the child has demonstrated improvement since the last visit, particularly in response to stimuli and early communication behaviors. However, some developmental concerns persist, and further analysis is necessary to determine underlying causes and guide targeted intervention strategies.

Recommended Plan:

1) Development Protocol for Information Processing

- Continue with the developmental intervention protocol for a period of **4 months**
- Conduct a **follow-up in-person reevaluation** after this period
- Establish a developmental and cognitive baseline to measure progress
- Modify the plan according to observed developmental outcomes

2) Main Recommended Analysis (through Neurazon – Canada):

3) Recommended Therapy After Determining the Causes:

- **Mitotherapy Therapy:** Intensive protocol tailored to energy and absorption profiles
- **Speech Therapy (ST):** 2 sessions per week
- **Occupational Therapy (OT):** 2 sessions per week
- A remote therapy plan may be created if in-person attendance is limited

This assessment is not a final diagnosis but a developmental evaluation based on current observations. The child is open to improvement, and the findings may change with progress and intervention.

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
