Overview

Rayyan was assessed on 08-10-2025 to evaluate his developmental progress. The assessment showed **information-processing delays and developmental delays** that have resulted in **acquired features of autism**, attributed to **epigenetic variants affecting brain development**.

While Rayyan presents with autism-like features, these are considered acquired rather than classical autism and may respond positively to targeted intervention. Further detailed analysis is not required at this stage to begin addressing his primary developmental challenges.

Recommended Plan

1. Development Protocol for Information Processing

- Continue the current protocol for 4 months followed by a reassessment in person.
- A **new baseline** will be established during the reassessment to guide further planning.
- Ensure consistency of intervention without interruption.

2. Recommended Tests

- No additional tests are required at this stage.
- Future testing may be considered depending on Rayyan's progress and clinical needs.

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3. Recommended Therapy

- **Plasticity Rehabilitation Therapy:** 2 sessions per week focusing on enhancing cognitive flexibility, attention, and processing speed.
- Rehabilitation Therapy and School: Integration with a rehabilitation-based program alongside schooling to support functional skills, social development, and academic readiness.

Conclusion

Rayyan's developmental profile highlights the need for **consistent and structured therapeutic intervention** to address his information-processing and developmental delays. Early action with the recommended therapies will be critical to improving his social interaction, learning, and adaptive skills, helping reduce the impact of his acquired autism features.
