

Director's Report on Developmental Progress Assessment

Overview:

Ayden was evaluated due to **Information Processing Delays, Developmental Delays, and hyperlexia closer to hyperlexia 2**, resulting in **acquired features of autism**. This assessment is not a definitive diagnosis. Ongoing support and further analysis are needed to develop a precise and effective intervention plan.

Recommended Plan:

1) Development Protocol for Information Processing:

- Implement a **non-chemical protocol** for information processing delays.
- Conduct this protocol for **4 months**, followed by an **in-person reassessment**.
- Establish a **baseline** for tracking progress and adjusting the plan as needed.

2) Main Recommended Analysis (via Neurazon – Canada):

3) Recommended Therapy After Determining the Causes:

- **Neuroplasticity Rehabilitation Therapy:** 2 sessions per week, both now and in later stages.
- **Speech Therapy (2ST) and Occupational Therapy (2OT):** Focus on communication, sensory integration, and cognitive development.


