Overview

Lilyan was assessed at our center on 06-09-2025. The evaluation revealed **information processing delays and developmental delays** that have contributed to **acquired features of autism**. While she currently does not meet the criteria for autism, these features indicate a developmental vulnerability that requires early intervention and further analyses.

The child demonstrates readiness to respond positively to structured support and intervention. Timely action will help improve her learning, communication, and adaptive functioning.

Recommended Plan

1) Development Protocol for the Information Processing

- Implement a structured **4-month development protocol** tailored for information processing.
- Conduct a **reevaluation after 4 months**, preferably in person.
- Establish a baseline during reevaluation to track measurable progress.
- Continue with the intervention plan and adapt as needed based on developmental changes.

2) Main Recommended Analyses (through Neurazon - Canada)

The recommended analyses are carried out through **Neurazon** (Canada). These tests are **external**, **optional**, **and not conducted directly** at our centers. They provide supportive insights to complement the therapeutic plan. Please refer to their report and assessment.





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3) Therapy

• **Neuroplasticity rehabilitation therapy:** To be introduced in **later stages**, with intensive structured sessions focusing on enhancing brain adaptability, language skills, and daily cognitive functions.

Conclusion

Lilyan presents with **information processing and developmental delays**, leading to **acquired features of autism**. Although she does not qualify as an autism case, intervention is necessary to ensure her developmental trajectory improves. With targeted therapy and follow-up analyses, she has a strong potential for progress.
