Director's Report on Developmental Progress Assessment

Overview:

Arin Mirani was assessed at our center on May 27th, 2025. The developmental evaluation revealed that the child exhibits **information processing delays** and **developmental delays**, which affect attention, cognitive flexibility, and language integration. However, based on current intellectual, developmental, and cognitive assessment tools, **Arin does not meet the criteria for autism**. The child shows potential for improvement and demonstrates strengths that require nurturing in the right environment. The child was assessed by Osthana.

To ensure developmental progression and motivation, we strongly recommend integrating Arin into a structured and regular academic or learning environment where she is consistently challenged and stimulated. Such environments will help maintain engagement, support neurodevelopment, and prevent cognitive stagnation.

Recommended Plan:

1) Development Protocol for Information Processing

- Begin/continue a personalized developmental protocol for 4 months
- Conduct an **in-person reevaluation** at the end of this period
- Establish a clear functional baseline for tracking progress
- Adjust the protocol based on new observations and response to therapy

2) Main Recommended Analysis (Conducted through Neurazon – Canada):

3) Recommended Therapy After Determining the Causes:

- Mitotherapy Therapy (Intensive): To support cellular energy, cognitive stamina, and mitochondrial function
- **Neuroplasticity Therapy (Intensive):** To improve processing speed, memory, language comprehension, and higher-level executive functions
