Overview:

Nahedd-Wasim Alzard was assessed at our center on July 24th, 2025. The evaluation revealed developmental delays and information processing difficulties. These challenges have led to characteristics closely resembling Hyperlexia Type 2, which can include advanced reading skills paired with difficulties in comprehension and social communication. These features align with traits often seen in high-functioning autism, though they do not meet the criteria for a classical autism diagnosis.

The child shows promising potential for improvement, particularly with the appropriate interventions in place. Continued support and reassessment will be essential to track progress and ensure effective response to therapy.

Recommended Plan

1. **Development Protocol for Information Processing:**
 - **Duration:** 4 months
 - **Focus:** Enhancing cognitive flexibility, social comprehension, and reducing rigidity associated with hyperlexic traits
 - **Follow-Up:** In-person reassessment after 4 months to evaluate progress and modify the plan as needed
2. **Recommended Therapy:**
 - **Neuroplasticity Rehabilitation Therapy:**
 - To be initiated in moderate form and increased in intensity over time
 - Targets brain network plasticity and cognitive regulation
 - **Speech and Occupational Therapy:**
 - To be continued in the child's home country under qualified professionals
 - Focused on improving expressive/receptive communication and adaptive functioning

Follow-Up Plan:

- **Reassessment Interval:**

It is recommended to reassess the child every 4 to 5 months to monitor improvements and adjust the treatment protocol accordingly.


