Director's Report on Developmental Progress Assessment

Overview:

Karam Sami Lasassmeh was assessed at our center on May 25th, 2025. The evaluation indicated **information processing delays**, **developmental delays**, and **learning difficulties**, all of which are contributing to **acquired features of autism**. However, the child **does not meet the full criteria for a clinical diagnosis of autism**. These features appear to be the result of delayed or atypical developmental processing rather than a neurodevelopmental disorder in itself.

Further analysis is needed to identify the root causes and to guide a more targeted and effective therapeutic plan.

Recommended Plan:

- 1. Development Protocol for Information Processing:
 - Apply the developmental protocol for 4 months
 - o Conduct an in-person reevaluation at the end of the period
 - Reestablish a clinical and developmental baseline and modify the intervention accordingly
- 2. Main Recommended Analysis (conducted through Neurazon Canada):

Please refer to their assessment. These analyses are conducted externally by Neurazon (Canada) and are not obligatory, but they are strongly recommended to guide a precision-based treatment plan.

- 3. Recommended Therapy After Determining the Causes:
 - Mitotherapy Therapy (intensive protocol) To support cellular and metabolic regulation
 - o Neuroplasticity Therapy To begin in September, based on readiness
 - Occupational Therapy (OT) To support sensory integration, motor coordination, and learning adaptability
