Director's Report on Developmental Progress Assessment

Overview:

Kareem Al Bardini was assessed at our center on July 24th, 2025. The child has shown significant improvement following the initial developmental intervention protocol. Most of the previously observed acquired features resembling autism have improved or resolved. However, Kareem still presents with developmental delays and challenges in information processing, now primarily manifesting as hyperactivity and features commonly seen in ADHD.

At this stage, Kareem does not meet the diagnostic criteria for Autism Spectrum Disorder or Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder. However, further monitoring and structured intervention remain essential to support continued improvement and to prevent regression.

Recommended Plan



- o **Duration:** 4 months
- o Goal: Strengthen attention, impulse control, and cognitive processing
- o Follow-Up: Reevaluate the child in person to measure outcomes and adjust the plan as needed
- 2. Recommended Therapy:
 - Neuroplasticity Rehabilitation Therapy
 - Begin with foundational sessions and gradually progress to intensive therapy as the child becomes more responsive
 - Focus areas: cognitive control, attention span, and adaptive functioning

• Reassessment Interval:

The child should be reassessed after 4 months to track developmental progress and ensure continued improvement with tailored support.
