Lucille was assessed at our center on 10-09-2025. The evaluation indicates information processing delays and developmental delays, leading to features of hyperlexia 1 and acquired features of autism. While she does not score as a definitive case of autism, these findings highlight the importance of targeted interventions. Lucille remains open for improvement and has strong potential to benefit from structured developmental and therapeutic support.

Recommended Plan:

1) Development Protocol for the Information Processing

- Continue the protocol for 4 months.
- Reevaluate after 4 months, preferably in person.
- Establish a new baseline and adjust the plan accordingly.
- Continue with consistent intervention strategies.

2) Main Recommended Analyses (Through Neurazon, Canada)

The recommended analyses are coordinated through **Neurazon** (Canada). Please note these are external tests, not conducted directly at our center. Please refer to their report and assessment.

3) Recommended Therapy

• Neuroplasticity rehabilitation therapy (intensive, in later stages).

This therapy will be important in strengthening processing abilities and developmental skills once the child is ready to begin more structured interventions.
