
Director's Report on Developmental Progress Assessment

Date of Visit: 14-07-2025

Child's Name: Yousuf-Badar Albalushi

Date of Birth: 24-05-2019

Overview:

Yousuf was assessed at our center for developmental and behavioral concerns. The evaluation revealed **information processing delays** and **developmental delays**, leading to **acquired features of high-functioning autism** due to an unresolved case of **Hyperlexia Type 2**. Additionally, the child demonstrates **minor cognitive delays**, which when combined with hyperlexia, may amplify the appearance of autism-related behaviors. These findings suggest that while the child is not a classic autism case, he presents with pseudo-autistic traits that can improve significantly with targeted intervention. Further assessment is needed to clarify the underlying causes and tailor support accordingly.

Recommended Plan:

1. Development Protocol for Information Processing:

- Begin with a non-medicinal developmental protocol focusing on improving information processing.
 - **Duration:** 4 months.
 - **Reevaluation:** In-person reassessment after 4 months to establish a new baseline and adjust the plan as necessary.
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Recommended Tests through Neurazon (Canada):

Recommended Therapy:

- **Therapy in the Child's Home Country:**
 - Initiate available speech, occupational, and behavioral therapies.
- **Neuroplasticity Rehabilitation Therapy:**
 - Not ready at this stage; to be introduced at a later stage depending on progress and readiness.


