Director's Report on Developmental Progress Assessment

Overview

Lamar was assessed for developmental functioning. Findings indicate **information processing delays** and broader **developmental delays** that have led to **acquired features of autism** driven by **biological causes**. She has **improved greatly on the first protocol**. We will **reassess in 4 months** to update baselines and refine goals.

School Recommendation (for the 2025–2026 year)

Lamar is capable of attending regular school and participating in the general curriculum. To ensure success, the following classroom accommodations are recommended:

- Instruction & pacing: Give extra processing time, directions in short, stepwise chunks, and a visual schedule/checklist.
- **Seating & environment:** Preferential seating (front/quiet side), minimize noise/visual distractions; access to **noise-reducing headphones** when needed.
- Materials: Use visual supports (pictures, graphic organizers), highlighted key words, and models/examples before independent work.
- Assessment: Allow quiet testing space, extended time, and option to answer orally or with a scribe/keyboardfor writing-heavy tasks.
- Workload: Reduce nonessential repetition; emphasize reading-for-meaning rather than rote decoding; break long tasks into smaller parts.
- Sensory & regulation: Provide movement breaks every 30–45 minutes; access to sensory tools (fidget, chair band).
- Communication & social: Prompted turn-taking, peer buddy for group work/recess, and clear advance warnings for transitions or schedule changes.
- **Support & monitoring:** Monthly check-ins with the family; consult with **SLT/OT** as needed; positive behavior supports (no punitive responses to regulation difficulties).
- Consider an IEP/Accommodation Plan documenting the above.





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Recommended Plan

1) Development Protocol for Information Processing

- Continue a structured protocol for **4 months** (attention, processing speed, working memory, comprehension).
- Reevaluate in person after 4 months to establish a new baseline and adjust goals.
- Continue and adapt the intervention according to measured progress.

2) Main Recommended Analysis

• Please refer to their report and analyses. These analyses are done through Neurazon and not EICADD.

3) Recommended Therapy

- Neuroplasticity Rehabilitation Therapy: 2–3 sessions per week (Jordan or UAE), focusing on processing efficiency, language comprehension, and self-regulation.
- Home program (15–20 minutes daily): joint-attention games, visual sequencing, turn-taking, and calm-breathing routines. We also recommend Speech and occupational therapy.

Conclusion

This document reflects a developmental assessment. Lamar is **well-positioned to thrive in a regular school setting** with the listed accommodations and will benefit from continued therapy and the planned reevaluation in 4 months.
