Saud Abdulwahab Alenzi was assessed at Ostathna Center. The child has shown **great improvement** on the first protocol. Saud presents with **information processing delays** and **developmental delays**, yet he is active, responsive, and continues to improve. His speech development has also progressed well.

Previous externally conducted analyses through **Neurazon (Canada)** revealed **variants affecting development**, leading to **acquired features of autism** but **not a true autism diagnosis**. Saud's improvement and responsiveness indicate a **high potential for further progress** with structured intervention.

Recommended Plan**1) Development Protocol for Information Processing**

- Continue for **4 months**, followed by reevaluation (preferably in person).
- Reestablish the baseline during the reevaluation.
- Continue with the recommended intervention sessions.

2) Recommended Therapy

- **Rehabilitation Therapy (Plasticity Rehabilitation / Occupational Therapy)**
 - Begin **intensive therapy**, or **1–2 sessions weekly**, every 4 months depending on progress.
 - Focus on cognitive, linguistic, and developmental pathways.

Notes on External Testing

All external analyses are performed through **Neurazon (Canada)**, a bioinformatics company partnered with internationally accredited laboratories.

These tests are **optional, external, and not performed directly** through Ostathna.

Parents should follow the Neurazon report for detailed interpretation.

The child is **open to improvement**, and findings may change with further development and intervention.
