

Assessment Overview

Hoor Salmen Huwail was assessed on 30-09-2025 at EICADD Center. The evaluation showed information processing delays, intellectual developmental delays, and global developmental delays including motor delays. These developmental challenges are linked to a genetic variant affecting white matter and brain development, which has also been reported to carry a risk of potential epileptic activity, as indicated by previous analyses.

Recommended Plan





- Begin a structured **4-month development protocol** aimed at supporting information processing.
- Reassess the child after 4 months, preferably in person, to establish a new baseline.
- Continue adapting and following the intervention plan based on progress.

2. Recommended Tests through Neurazon (Canada)

Note: The recommended tests are conducted through Neurazon (Canada), a bioinformatics company partnered with certified laboratories worldwide.

These tests are **recommendations**, **not obligatory**, and they are **not conducted directly through our center – EICADD**.

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3. Recommended Therapy (After Determining Underlying Causes)

• Occupational Therapy (OT): 2 sessions/week

• Speech Therapy (ST): 2 sessions/week

• **Plasticity Rehabilitation Therapy:** 2 OT sessions/week focusing on neuroplasticity-based interventions

• Physiotherapy: Continue as part of the motor delay support plan

Conclusion

Hoor is open to improvement with structured intervention. The plan focuses on addressing information processing delays, global developmental delays, and motor challenges. Future adjustments will depend on progress and follow-up assessments.
