Overview

Mohammad was assessed at our center for developmental progress. The evaluation revealed **information processing delays** and **cognitive developmental delays**, which have contributed to **acquired features of autism**. Encouragingly, the child has **improved greatly on the first protocol**, showing readiness for continued structured support. Further assessments are needed to fully understand the underlying causes and to tailor future interventions.

Recommended Plan



- 1. Continue with a structured, non-medicinal developmental protocol addressing information processing skills.
- 2. Duration: 4 months, followed by reevaluation (preferably in person).
- 3. Reassess baseline progress at the next evaluation and adjust the plan accordingly.
- 4. Continue with the intervention plan to sustain and build on improvements.

2. Recommended Therapy

• **Neuroplasticity Rehabilitation Therapy:** To be initiated in later stages when the child is ready. Intensive sessions will support brain connectivity, learning, and overall cognitive development.





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Conclusion

This assessment confirms that Mohammad presents with information processing and cognitive delays leading to acquired autism features. However, the child has responded positively to the initial protocol, showing great potential for continued progress. Ongoing structured interventions, with the eventual introduction of neuroplasticity therapy, will be critical in supporting further development.
