### Director's Report on Developmental Progress Assessment

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### Overview:

Naji Abdulla Farhan Awad Eid visited our center for a developmental progress assessment. The child has shown **notable improvement following the first protocol**, indicating a **high potential for further developmental progress**.

The assessment revealed that Naji presents with **information processing delays and developmental delays**, alongside **acquired features of autism**, as reported by the **Neurazon Precision Health Analysis (Canada)** conducted externally. The child's developmental profile reflects delays that are **acquired rather than genetic autism**, suggesting a positive prognosis with continued intervention and neurorehabilitation.

Naji's progress so far demonstrates good responsiveness to the intervention plan, though **further improvement and continued structured therapy** remain essential to maximize outcomes.

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### Recommended Plan:

#### 1) Development Protocol for Information Processing

- Continue with the **developmental protocol** for 4 months, followed by **reevaluation**, preferably in person.
- Reassess and establish a **new developmental baseline** after each cycle.
- Continue with the **therapy sessions** to maintain consistent developmental momentum.

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#### 2) Main Recommended Analysis:
