

Director's Report on Developmental Progress Assessment

Overview:

Abdallah Kanaan visited our center for a developmental progress assessment. The evaluation revealed signs of **information processing delays** and **developmental delays**, which appear to be linked to specific **genetic variants** identified earlier. Additionally, signs of **hyperlexia-like characteristics** were observed. These findings suggest a need for a structured developmental plan and further ongoing evaluation.

Recommended Plan:

1. Development Protocol for Information Processing

- To be implemented over the next 4 months.
- Follow-up reassessment is advised, preferably in person.
- The plan will be reevaluated and adjusted based on observed progress.

2. Recommended Tests (through Neurazon – Canada):

3. Recommended Therapy:

- **Mitotherapy Intensive** (2–3 sessions weekly)
- **Neuroplasticity Intensive Program**
- **Occupational Therapy & Sensory Integration** (2 OT sessions weekly)
- **Speech Therapy** (2 ST sessions weekly)

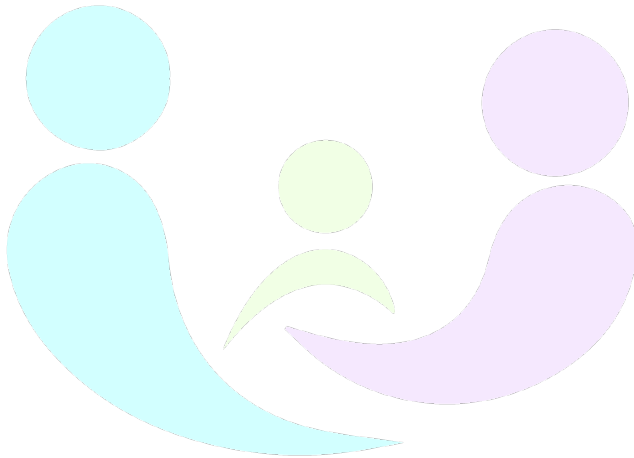
