Director's Report on Developmental Progress Assessment

Overview:

Othman was assessed at our center on 08-09-2025. The evaluation revealed information processing delays and global developmental delays, which have led to acquired features of autism and cognitive delays. While these challenges are present, it is important to note that Othman has potential for progress with targeted intervention and consistent follow-up. Further analyses are necessary to clarify the underlying factors influencing his development and to guide a more tailored intervention plan.

Recommended Plan:

1. Development Protocol for the Information Processing

- Implement a structured 4-month protocol targeting information processing.
- Reevaluate after 4 months, preferably in person.
- Establish a baseline during reevaluation for measurable tracking.
- Continue with the intervention plan as progress is observed.

2. Main Recommended Analyses (through Neurazon – Canada):

The recommended tests are external and conducted through Neurazon (Canada). Please note that these are suggestions, not obligatory, and not performed directly through our centers. They serve as supportive tools to better understand the child's developmental profile.

3. Therapy:

- Neuroplasticity rehabilitation therapy is recommended but to begin in **later stages**, once the child is ready for intensive sessions. This therapy will play a key role in strengthening cognitive processing, communication, and adaptive functioning.

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Conclusion:

Othman presents with information processing and global developmental delays contributing to acquired autism features and cognitive delays. With continued monitoring, targeted therapies, and additional analyses, he remains capable of improvement. The next 4 months will be crucial in establishing a developmental baseline and adapting his intervention plan accordingly.


