Director's Report on Developmental Progress Assessment

Overview:

Reem and Noora AlQahtani visited our center for follow-up developmental assessments. Both children showed significant improvement following the initial intervention protocols. However, both still exhibit **information processing delays**resulting from underlying **developmental delays**, which have led to **acquired features of Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD)**. It is important to note that these features are not indicative of classic or genetically rooted autism but rather acquired developmental patterns that can improve with proper support. Further evaluation is necessary to assess the full extent of improvement and determine the next phase of intervention.

Recommended Plan:

- 1. Developmental Non-Medicinal Protocol for Information Processing:
 - o Duration: Continue for 4 to 6 months.
 - Follow-Up: A full reassessment is recommended at the end of this period, preferably in person.
 - Objective: Establish a new developmental baseline and adjust the protocol accordingly.
- 2. Main Recommended Analysis (Through Canada via Neurazon):
 - Please refer to their report and assessment.
- 3. Recommended Therapy:
 - Neuroplasticity Rehabilitation Therapy (Intensive):
 - Frequency and duration to be tailored according to individual response and availability.
