Overview

Sanad Tareq Qawadri was assessed at **Ostathna** on 01 October 2025. The evaluation showed that Sanad presents with **information-processing delays** but **does not meet the criteria for autism**.

Although autism is not indicated, the identified delays in information processing underline the importance of early and focused intervention to support learning, attention, and cognitive flexibility.

Recommended Plan

1) Development Protocol for Information Processing

- Continue with the tailored **development protocol** for **4 months**.
- Reassess after 4 months — preferably **in person** — to establish a baseline and adjust the plan as needed.
- Maintain the intervention plan to enhance cognitive and adaptive skills.

2) Recommended Tests – Conducted through Neurazon (Canada)

- **No additional biomedical analyses are required at this stage.**
Focus will remain on therapy and skills training unless new findings suggest further evaluation in the future.

Notes on External Testing:

Should future analyses become necessary, they would be recommended through **Neurazon (Canada)**, a bioinformatics company partnered with certified laboratories worldwide.

Please note that such tests would be recommendations and not obligatory, and they are not conducted directly by **Ostathna**.

3) Recommended Therapy

- **Plasticity Rehabilitation Therapy:**

- Recommended **2–3 sessions per week** to improve neuronal connectivity, enhance cognitive processing speed, and strengthen adaptive learning skills.

Conclusion

Sanad demonstrates **information-processing delays without signs of autism**. Early and consistent **plasticity-focused therapy** will be critical to advancing his developmental progress and supporting his educational needs.

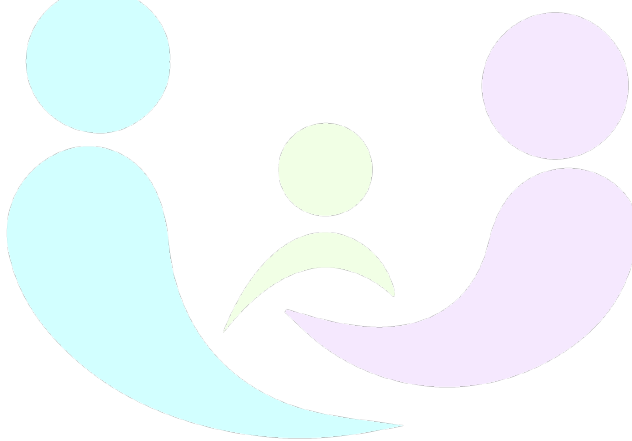
