Assessment

The child presents with **information processing delays and developmental delay**, leading to features of **hyperlexia approaching Type 3**, though not fully established. These delays have contributed to **acquired features of autism**, but the child does not meet the criteria for a diagnosis of autism. Further analyses are required to determine the underlying biomedical and developmental contributors.

Recommended Plan

1) Development Protocol (Rehabilitation Focus)



- Continue with the information processing rehabilitation protocol for the next 4 months.
- Reevaluate the child, preferably in person, after 4 months to establish a new baseline.
- Continue with a structured intervention plan tailored to cognitive and linguistic development.

2) Recommended Tests through Neurazon (Canada)

To further investigate the child's biomedical profile and support precision health interventions. Please refer to their report and assessment. These analyses are not done at EICADD.

3) Recommended Therapy

- Neuroplasticity Rehabilitation Therapy intensive program to begin as soon as possible.
- Therapy should include **speech therapy, occupational therapy, and cognitive training**, with focus on enhancing language processing and comprehension, while addressing hyperlexia-related challenges.

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Conclusion

The child demonstrates **developmental and information processing delays** with emerging hyperlexia features, contributing to acquired autistic traits. With continued rehabilitation, precise biomedical analyses, and targeted therapy, the child is open to significant improvement.
