Director's Report on Developmental Progress Assessment

Overview

Hamad and his twin brother Nasser were assessed at our center on 06-09-2025. Both children demonstrated **information processing delays and developmental delays** that have contributed to **acquired features of autism**. Importantly, neither child currently meets the criteria for autism but both require **close monitoring and intervention** to prevent further developmental risks.

The assessment highlights that with **appropriate intervention and structured therapy**, both children have the potential for meaningful improvement. Further analyses are necessary to determine the underlying biological and neurological factors contributing to their developmental profile.

Recommended Plan

1) Development Protocol for the Information Processing

- Implement a **structured 4-month developmental protocol** for both children.
- Reevaluate after 4 months, preferably in person, to establish a **clear developmental baseline**.
- Continue with the intervention plan and adjust as needed depending on progress.

2) Main Recommended Analyses (through Neurazon – Canada)

The recommended analyses are facilitated through **Neurazon (Canada)**. These tests are **external, not obligatory**, and not conducted directly through our centers. They are intended to provide deeper insights into the children's developmental needs. Please refer to their report and assessment.

3) Therapy

- **Neuroplasticity rehabilitation therapy:** To be introduced in later stages, intensive, with structured sessions focusing on enhancing brain adaptability, memory, and cognitive flexibility.
- **Speech and occupational therapy:** To support communication, sensory integration, and daily developmental skills.

Conclusion

Hamad and Nasser both present with **information processing and developmental delays**, with **acquired features of autism** but without scoring as autism cases. Their developmental profile indicates that the right interventions can yield significant improvement. Early intervention remains critical to support their progress and reduce risks of long-term impact.
