Director's Report on Developmental Progress Assessment

Overview:

Amna Khalid Alkooheji visited our center for a developmental progress assessment. The evaluation revealed that the child presents with **information processing delays and global developmental delays**, leading to **acquired features of autism** and **features of intellectual developmental delays**.

These findings suggest that the child's developmental profile is influenced by underlying neurodevelopmental factors that affect information processing and cognitive integration. Continued multidisciplinary intervention and periodic reassessment are essential to ensure consistent improvement and to refine the intervention plan based on developmental progress.

Further analyses are recommended to understand the biological and functional aspects contributing to the developmental pattern.

Recommended Plan:

1) Development Protocol for Information Processing

- Continue the structured **developmental protocol** for 4 months.
- Reevaluate the child's progress after this period, preferably in person.
- Establish a new baseline following reevaluation.
- Continue with the current intervention plan while reinforcing home-based developmental activities.

2) Recommended Tests through Neurazon (Canada):

3) Recommended Therapy:

- **Rehabilitation Therapy – Plasticity Rehabilitation Therapy** (in later stages)
- **Rehabilitation Therapy – Occupational Therapy and Speech Therapy** (continue as ongoing sessions)
 - Focus: sensory integration, expressive/receptive language, motor coordination, and social communication enhancement.

Conclusion:

This assessment is a **developmental evaluation**, not a final diagnosis. Amna is capable of improvement with consistent intervention, multidisciplinary support, and family participation. The assessment remains open to change based on observed progress in future evaluations.

The recommendations provided are based on research and align with **Neurazon's developmental guidance protocols** to promote continuous improvement in cognitive and adaptive functioning.

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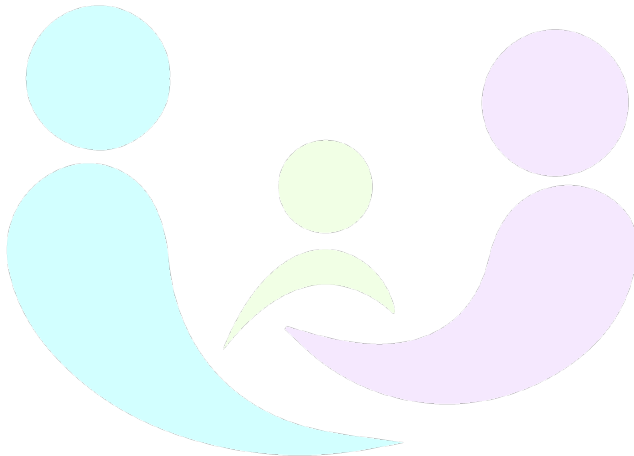
