

Director's Report on Developmental Progress Assessment

Overview:

Kindah Qurah Yousef was reassessed following her previous intervention protocol. The child has shown **notable improvement** in both **information processing** and **overall developmental performance**. She continues to present with **developmental delays** and **processing difficulties**, but her progress is promising and clearly reflects the positive impact of the current therapeutic plan.

According to findings from the **Precision Health Analysis conducted through Neurazon (Canada)**, Kindah carries **genetic variants that affect neurodevelopment**, contributing to **acquired features of autism**. These features are not considered to reflect a true autism diagnosis but rather an adaptive result of developmental delays and disrupted cognitive pathways caused by the identified variants.

Recommended Plan:

1. Development Protocol for Information Processing

- Continue the structured development protocol for a **period of 4 months**.
- Child should be **reassessed in person**, if possible, to monitor progress and refine the treatment strategy.
- Reevaluate baseline cognitive and functional performance and adjust intervention plan accordingly.

2. Recommended Therapy:

- Continue **Intensive Neuroplasticity Rehabilitation Therapy**, ideally **2 to 3 sessions per week**, to enhance **brain** adaptability, improve cognitive pathways, and support functional development.

Conclusion:

Kindah Qurah Yousef is showing strong potential for continued improvement. The current plan should be maintained, with close monitoring and in-person reassessment after four months. Her case remains responsive to intervention, and further gains are expected with consistency and personalized support.


