

Director's Report on Developmental Progress Assessment

Date of Visit: May 3rd, 2025

Child's Name: Miral Wadie Ben Messaoud

Date of Birth: March 3rd, 2014

Assessment:

Miral was assessed in person and found to have **information processing delays, features of intellectual developmental delays, and acquired features of autism**. These findings correlate with **white matter delays** as observed in an MRI report presented by her neurologist in Tunisia. Further functional analysis is required to guide targeted intervention.

Recommended Plan:

1) Development Protocol for Information Processing:

- Continue the intervention protocol for **4 months**
- Reevaluate the child **preferably in person**
- Establish a new developmental baseline
- Maintain consistent developmental therapy sessions

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2) Recommended Tests:

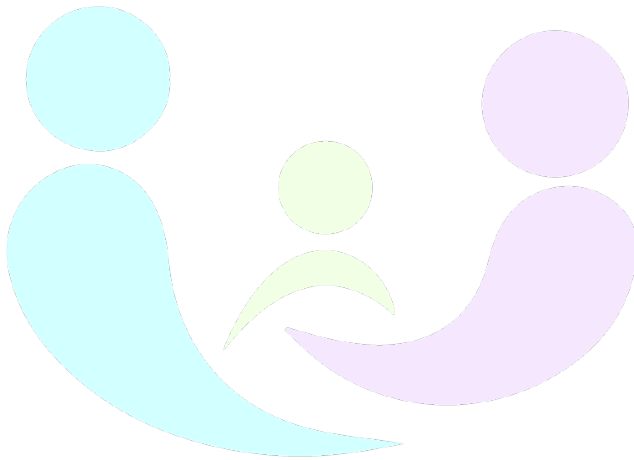
- **Precision Health Analysis – Neurazon (Canada)**
Purpose: A more detailed analysis of the underlying causes
Sample: Saliva
Turnaround: 4 months business days
- **Neuronal Growth Factors Analysis – Neurazon (Canada)**
Purpose: A more detailed analysis of neuronal absorption
Sample: Hair
Turnaround: 2 months business days
Frequency: Repeated every 6–12 months
- **Gut Intolerance Analysis – Neurazon (Canada)**
Purpose: A more detailed analysis of gastrointestinal intolerance
Sample: Hair
Turnaround: 2 months business days
Frequency: Repeated every 6–12 months

3) Recommended Therapy:

- **Neuroplasticity rehabilitation therapy** – to be conducted in UAE


Conclusion:
