

Overview:

Omar Alkatib was assessed at our center on July 24th, 2025. The evaluation revealed both developmental and information processing delays, which have contributed to acquired features resembling autism spectrum characteristics. Additionally, the child shows signs consistent with intellectual developmental delays, particularly in comprehension, expressive abilities, and adaptive responses. The child has positive delays in white matter as shown in previous MRI done by neurologists and positive EEG.

Despite the current challenges, Omar is capable of improvement with appropriate intervention and consistent follow-up. His condition remains open to progress, especially through tailored neurodevelopmental strategies.

Recommended Plan



- o **Duration:** 4 months
- o **Goals:** Establish baseline for cognitive and developmental function, and reduce processing delays
- o **Follow-Up:** In-person reassessment after 4 months to modify and optimize the intervention protocol

2. Recommended Therapy:

- Neuroplasticity Rehabilitation Therapy:
 - To begin at a moderate pace and increase in intensity in later stages
 - Focus: Strengthening white matter pathways, attention, communication, and problem-solving skills

Speech and Occupational Therapy:

- To be continued in the child's home country
- Focus: Enhancing language development, fine motor coordination, and adaptive behavior

• Reassessment Interval:

A full reassessment is recommended in 4 months to evaluate developmental gains and modify support strategies as needed.
