
Director's Report on Developmental Progress Assessment

Overview:

Azhaar visited our center for a developmental progress assessment. The evaluation revealed **information processing delays** and **global developmental delays**, which have contributed to **acquired features of autism** and **acquired features of intellectual developmental delays**.

These findings indicate that the child's developmental challenges are not static but acquired due to underlying processing and neurobiological factors. With appropriate intervention, the child's progress potential remains open and promising. Further biological analysis is recommended to better understand the contributing factors and to personalize the rehabilitation strategy.

Recommended Plan:

1) Development Protocol for Information Processing

- Implement a **development protocol** focused on information processing and learning for **4 months**, followed by an **in-person reassessment**.
 - Reevaluate the plan and establish a new baseline for continued developmental progress.
 - Continue with structured therapy sessions and reinforce cognitive, communication, and adaptive learning skills.
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2) Recommended Tests through Neurazon (Canada)

Parents are encouraged to follow the **testing plan provided by Neurazon** for additional information and coordination regarding timelines and interpretation of results.

3) Recommended Therapy

- **Rehabilitation Therapy – Plasticity Therapy:**
To be initiated in **later stages**, once the next reassessment and biological analyses are complete, to optimize readiness and response to therapy.
- **Supportive Therapy:**
Speech, occupational, and behavioral intervention should continue to promote steady developmental progress.

Notes on External Testing (Neurazon – Canada)

The recommended tests are conducted through **Neurazon (Canada)**, a bioinformatics company partnered with certified international laboratories. These analyses provide a deeper understanding of biological and neurological contributors to developmental outcomes.
