## Diagnosis:

Atypical autism

## Complain:

We had the pleasure of seeing Lana Ahmed in our pediatric neurology clinic at Dallah Hospital, Al-Khabir.

The family feels concerned about the actions displayed by their child, who has no health issues. The child presents with inadequate eye contact and concentration; delayed speech that is out of character for the age; delayed language, both receptive and expressive; repetitive and habitual behavior and action; and hyperactivity, impulsivity, and irritability. The symptoms began when the child was 18 months old.

No developmental regression or seizure history, and no prior neurological illness. No family history of such presentations exists. None of the prenatal or postnatal experiences stand out, and they have little bearing on the current state of health. No prior medical history of allergies, blood transfusions, or surgery.

The child is currently on Risperidone 1.25 mg po OD

The review of systems was unremarkable.

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The neurological and systemic evaluations yield no noteworthy results. The child has no acute distress. Skin examination showed no hyper- or hypopigmented lesions, axillary or inguinal freckling, or rashes. The head, ears, eyes, nose, and throat examinations were generally unremarkable. There were no dysmorphic facial features. There was no cervical lymphadenopathy. The chest was clear to auscultation. The heart had a regular rate with no murmurs, rubs, or gallops. The abdomen was soft, non-tender, and non-distended, with no hepatosplenomegaly and no masses.

The child is alert. Pupils were equal and reactive. Extraocular movements were intact without nystagmus. The face was symmetrical and strong. The tongue, uvula, and palate were midline. Tone, power, and reflexes were normal.

The current diagnosis for the child is autism spectrum disorder. The child requires intense speech,

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occupational, and behavioral therapies in addition to a comprehensive early intervention program for autism and ADHD. Unfortunately, we do not offer these services at our institute. Therefore, the child must undergo these treatments at a rehabilitation facility.
